The Berry Pickers by Amanda Peters

A haunting and beautiful story of a young girl that goes missing and the impact and influence on her life and those around her. One desperate act changes the course of two families forever: that of the family that never gave up hope and the family that never told why.

The Honor of Your Presence by Dave Eggers

Sweet novella. Helen's business is to create invitations for events. When her Uncle Peter dares her to use an invitation to crash one of the events, hilarity ensues. Feel good fiction.

The Last Love Note by Emma Gray

Sweet note on love after death.

The Mystery Guest by Nita Prose

Molly Gray has returned as the quirky and delightful maid at the Regency Grand Hotel. When a renowned writer is killed there, Molly must defend her job and the other people who work there and the work of the other housekeepers who become prime suspects. I loved Molly's sayings, especially "tissues for your issues". A charming sequel, I enjoyed this one immensely.

The Storm We Made by Vanessa Chan

Informative historical fiction of the Japanese takeover of Malaysia during WWII. One woman's actions before the start of the war have long lasting ramifications for her family and those in her orbit.

What We Kept to Ourselves by Nancy Jooyan Kim

Gripping family novel of an immigrant family filled with secrets from Korea and how it affects the present day.

Sisters Under the Rising Sun by Heather Morris

Astonishing historical fiction account of the bravery and heroism of the Australian nurses and British citizens captured by the Japanese and interred in Indonesia during WWII. The author's note at the end of the novel really puts things in perspective. I usually say I'm done with WWII books, however, I love learning something new and the bravery of Nesta and Norah should be known by the entire world.

The Other Princess by Denny S. Bryce

Gorgeous historical fiction novel about the African princess Sara Forbes Bonetta, Queen Victoria's ward and goddaughter. This book tells her story from the richness of her African birth, to the horror of her enslavement by the Dahomey, to her being a "gift" to the Queen. Sara's life is told through the pages with elegant detail and is refreshingly honest in the portrait of what it meant to be Black girl among Britain's royal confines.
